JUNE MEETING presentation – notes by Susan Ehrenberg

PLANT PHOTOGRAPHY

Bronwyn Flack, from the local photography group, made an interesting presentation on plant photography, with many useful tips for the 'amateur'.

Points to consider when photographing plants.

- Lens choice is flexible depending on the depth of field and sharpness required. A macro lens is particularly good for focussing on objects close to the camera; alternatively, a suitably stabilised telephoto or zoom lens is fine.
- Camera shake, which causes photo blurring, can be reduced by using a tripod and then turning lens auto-stabilisation off. Other shake reduction methods include the use of a remote camera shutter switch or setting a 2 second delay on shutter release. Alternatively, set shutter speed at 1/160 second or faster. And you can 'cheat' by clamping part of the plant stationary.
- Subjects look better on cloudy days or in morning/evening (the golden hour) as this brings out more texture detail and colour.



Use this sensible macro lens, Ken, and use the tripod – you shake too much!
