Wednesday 12th April, 2023. Monthly Meeting at 2pm \* (Note: Afternoon Meeting) \* At the Robert Clark Horticultural Centre. Ballarat Botanical Gardens Guest Speaker: Jeff Rootes is a wildlife corridor and biodiversity advocate in Ballarat.

He is secretary of two community-based environmental organisations, the Bunanyung Landscape Alliance and the Friends of Canadian Corridor.

Jeff is an advocate for landscape-scale wildlife and biodiverse connections between the Wombat Forest and the Enfield Forest. His advocacy and work include landscape scale, restoration, development of a climate adaption strategy for Goldfields Little Creeks, the establishment of the Woowookarung Regional Park and a citizen science Koala sighting program now into its fifth year.

#### The Garden at Elaine March

The wet winter and spring, followed by long dry periods in summer have proved to be fatal for quite a few plants so there are gaps in the garden. The recent rain has probably been enough for the re-planting to start: the young shrubs should be reasonably established before winter.

Some plants are flowering more than usual. Alyogyne hakeafolia is the best it has ever been, as are the Banksia marginata. Hemiandra pungens has been flowering for months.

The trunk of the White Sallee or Snow Gum, Eucalyptus pauciflora is a random pattern of fawn, brown, grey and white: if it were in a colder climate, it would be brightly coloured.

A Queensland wattle Acacia elata, Cedar Wattle, is flowering for the first time, a little late as it is usually summer flowering. Other trees in flower are Hakea drupaceae, and Backhousia citrodora, Lemon Myrtle (A fairly large rain-forest tree but our's is a shrub as it is growing in a large pot) Ground-covers in bloom include Myoporum acuminatum and Grevillea lanigera.

Westringea glabra and W. 'Jarvis Gem' flower for a long period.

Melaleuca pulchella (Claw Flower) and M. thymifolia are well covered with blooms, M. elliptica is just starting.

Other plants in flower include Hibiscus geranioides, Eremophilla calorhabdos, E. polyclada, Goodenia varia and the pink flowered Kunzia baxterii.

Due to last-minute, unexpected and unavoidable events, we have been unable to fully and properly produce this newsletter. Additionally, this has resulted in the omission of photographs sent in by members.
