June Guest Speaker Report - Peter Debicki – 'The Polish Beekeeper'

Peter has over 150 hives, which are currently near the Little Desert National Park. As well as producing honey, he contracts hives out to assist pollination, for example, to almond growers in northern Victoria. With 30% of food pollinated by bees, populations of healthy bees are vital. Update on the Varroa Destructor mite: It's here to stay and now thought to have possibly been in

Australia for at least 18 months before it was first detected. The mite is a parasite of honeybees, it doesn't feed on native bees. It needs a breeding bee colony to feed on the larvae, then reproduce in the larvae. Infestation can spread viruses which cause the death of the whole colony. In September 2023 the official strategy for dealing with Varroa changed from eradication to management.

Various organic and non-organic chemical treatments are being trialled.

Some of Peter's favourite bee-attracting native plants:

☐ Hakea - early pollen
Correa - almost all, but especially bell-shaped flowers - pollen and nectar
Grevilleas - pollen and nectar
Desert banksia (and other banksias) - high-protein pollen as well as nectar
Desert Tea-tree

Silver Banksia (*Banksia marginata*) North Gardens Wetlands (near Lake Wendouree)

Grevillea 'Coastal Impressive' growing in the garden of Jennifer Johnson. It is a fast growing, medium to tall shrub with fine pendulous foliage. This Queensland-bred grevillea blooms for most of the year, bearing masses of dusty pink coloured flowers which attract a wide range of honey-eating birds. Flowers and foliage last well in floral arrangements. It is ideal for suburban gardens. Mass plant to create a screen or hedge. It will tolerate most soil conditions, and benefits from a fertilizer high in nitrogen in Spring and Mid-Summer. Do not overwater. Prune regularly to promote fresh new growth and maintain desired shape.
