






VENUE FOR SATURDAY 24 OCTOBER 2020

The Saturday proceedings and the evening dinner of the 13th FJC Rogers Seminar will be held at the Eltham Community and Reception Centre, 801 Main Rd, Eltham. Many of you will be familiar with this venue as this is where APS Yarra Yarra holds its flagship yearly EXPO and Plant Sales event in mid-September. This venue is set amidst 5 acres of native gardens and has plenty of parking accessible via Main Road/Pitt Street.



The main hall (the Dorian LeGallienne Room) seats up to 300 people for the day proceedings and up to 160 for the Evening dinner. It has full disability access to all areas. Lunch and teas will be available in the Atrium (outside the main hall), and there are plenty of places to eat both within and outside

PLANT SALES

The APS Yarra Yarra Growers are a group of propagators within APS YY that collaborate with Latrobe Wildlife Sanctuary and Indigenous Nursery. We have been busy propagating plants for this seminar since early 2018 and have a large number of species on the go, mostly Prostanthera and Westringia. Much of the cutting material and plants have been originally sourced by Mike Williams and Miriam Ford. In addition we are being assisted by other growers such as Phil Vaughan who will be selling grafted plants from within the Mint Bush and Allied Genera Family only, Russell Wait, Craig Dodgson & Tony Hughes and Friends of the Melton Botanic Garden who are helping with *Dasymalla terminalis* (native foxglove).

GENERA OF THE SUBFAMILY PROSTANTHEROIDEAE:

There are two tribes within this Subfamily of Lamiaceae, the Chloantheae & Westringiae with 17 Genera within: Brachysola — Chloanthes — Cyanostegia — Dasymalla — Dicrastylis — Hemiandra — Hemigenia — Hemiphora — Lachnostachys — Microcorys — Muniria — Newcastelia — Physopsis — Pityrodia — Prostanthera — Quoya — Westringia. Prostanthera has the largest numbers of species with over 100 and Brachysola the least with just 2.

HANGING BASKETS

Many of the species listed within the Prostantheroideae genera lend themselves to life in a hanging basket. Indeed for many of us on the Eastern states who have to contend with high humidity and don't have deep sand for excellent drainage this may be the only way to grow them. There will be a small selection of hanging baskets available for sale and as raffle prizes for those of you

able to transport them back home. As an example of what is possible:

The MIFGS Hanging Basket

This year the APSYY Growers took on the task of creating a fully- Australian- plants- only designed hanging basket for the RHSV Hanging Basket competition at the Melbourne International Flower and Garden Show in late March, 2020. Furthermore the basket

consists solely of species from our Mint Bush and Allied Genera collection as we wanted to promote this seminar and because many of the species are spectacular and flower well over the warmer months. The species chosen include *Prostanthera eckersleyana* a central focal point, grafted from Phil Vaughan) with beautiful large paired purple flowers and aromatic crinkly foliage, *Hemiandra gardneri* (grafted, grey spikey foliage, gorgeous pink red flowers), *Prostanthera incisa* (incised foliage, aromatic, edible bush food species) & *Hemiandra pungens* (green foliage, stunning white flowers). Accommodation

If you are planning to register, book your accommodation early. We suggest you simply search the internet for accommodation in the Eltham area and focus on the closer suburbs such as Eltham, Diamond Creek, Research, Montmorency & Greensborough.



There are two motels in Eltham, (Eltham Motor Inn at 1450 Main Rd, and Eltham Gateway Hotel at 1339 Main Rd) but these will be booked out fairly quickly. Some rooms at the Eltham Gateway have temporarily been set aside for Seminar attendees. Other suburbs to check out for accommodation within 30 minutes by car include Doncaster, Templestowe, Warrandyte, and Box Hill.
