It features many small Eucalypts, especially Eucalyptus 'Silver Princess', a wide range of Hakeas, lots of Correas, some lovely Dampieras, small Myrtaceae and many other treasures. Many of the flower specimens picked for the Pomonal Native Flower Show come from this garden.

It also features a landscaped pond, a wetland, gravel mulched garden beds, native and South African cut flowers, wonderful bird life and a large collection of Carnivorous plants. Come and see wind, frost, flood, wallaby and drought hardy plants with a mountain backdrop to die for. Areas of this garden are wheel chair friendly.

Linda and David run a small nursery with a good range of small, medium and large shrubs in maxi tubes. This beautiful property is also for sale.

Wetlands and Garden to Visit

Weir Park Wetlands and Gary and Beverley Aitken's Garden Barnes Boulevard, Horsham

A visit to some of Horsham's wetlands is a must. These wetlands back onto Gary and Beverley Aitken's garden. Follow Barnes Boulevard along the river to Weir Park. There is a great picnic spot with shelters, bbqs and toilets etc just before the weir. Drive past the picnic area to the car park.

Once you get there, it is the start of a walking circuit which takes walkers along the river and around a unique wetland that filters urban storm water into quality water before it enters the river. It's a place to recharge the human batteries

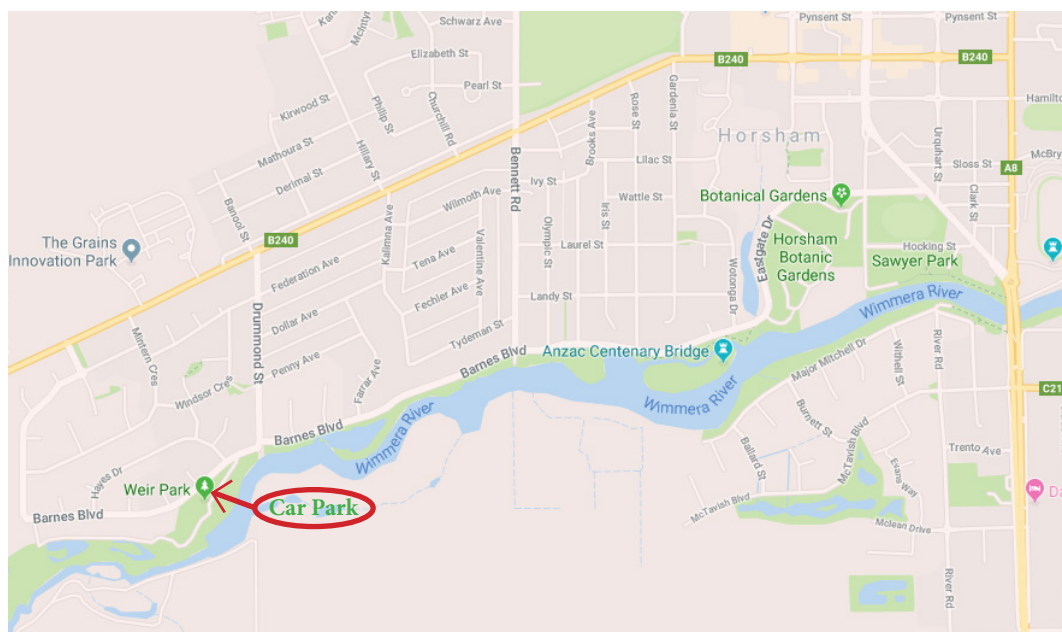
and a haven for many birds. Now this all leads you to the Aitken's back gate. A garden loved by the local wallabies who think it's their local tuck shop. You are also welcome to see what's left.

For those who wish to walk through the wetlands and visit the Aitken garden please make prior arrangements. Gary Aitken will meet you at Weir Park car park and take you on a guided tour through the wetlands and into their garden. You will need at least one hour plus.

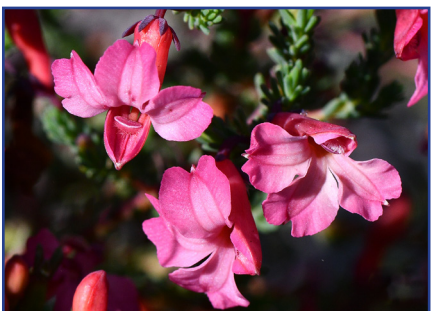

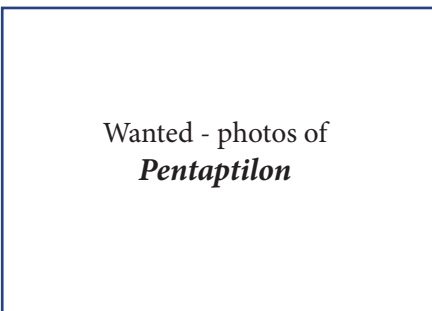

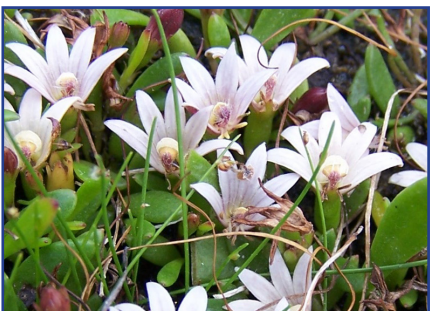
